RUCIFICION was one of the most cruel ways of killing invented. It lasted for hours, sometimes even days. The sufferer was fixed, hands and feet, and hung, suffocating, unless he raised himself painfully, on the spikes through his limbs, to take gasps of breath.

It was a very public spectacle, to humiliate the victim, frighten everybody. He was stripped naked. He heard the hurtful mockery of bystanders. He had to see the pain of those who loved him, looking on. It was an added satisfaction for his torturers, that he could speak.

Many must have screamed, raged, cursed, or begged for mercy. Jesus' behaviour would have been noticeable, as very different. Such a scene was meant to be the culmination of Jesus' life. It was described as such, in detail, in each of the four Gospels. It was all for our 'salvation': to 'deliver us from evil'.

He had to die, as we all do. He suffered pain, more than most of us ever do. It was to show that all this suffering comes to an end. It ends in glory, in a new life, without sin, sorrow, even death. He showed this to them, in His appearances, and ascension. We didn't see, but we hear, and believe, and are so blessed.

We are to see God, as He did, to trust in Him, to do all this, in all this. If we do, this is true love, and a triumph for the Spirit we share with Him. So the image of the cross He died on, became the 'sign of life' for us.

An irreligious friend once asked me how we can bear to have the crucifix, everywhere, even in a hall where dancing was going on. I tried to explain, that it was the sign of faith, and hope, and love. It was very hard. She hadn't thought about it, heard the gospels, prayed, learned, and practised the message, as we have done. This is why we do all this, and in our church, of the Holy Cross.
