CONCERNING MONEY MATTERS

HARLES Dickens' character Mr Micawber is well known for his saving: 'Annual income, twenty pounds; annual expenditure, nineteen pounds nineteen and six: result, happiness. Annual income, twenty pounds; annual expenditure, twenty pounds ought and six: result, misery'. In other words, spend more than you receive and the result is unhappiness.

We realised recently, from examining the Parish annual accounts for 2010-2011, that we were getting into Mr Micawber's misery bracket. Well, perhaps not actual misery yet; but to have an annual deficit is certainly heading for difficulties. So we felt it was necessary to tell you about it, by the notice that was read out at Mass a few week-ends ago.

The finances of the Parish are the concern of us all. Fr Thomas and his assistants have the job of administering the accounts; but we all have some involvement, even if only a very small one, in the raising and the spending of the Parish money. The Parish Finance Committee has been in abeyance recently, but we are in the process of reviving it, and when it is up and running it will be the body which everyone can refer to with suggestions or concerns, or simply for information. And a summary of the annual accounts will be published for all to see.

Meanwhile we need to think of ways to increase the Parish income. I know this is not a good time to ask you to give more. The recession is getting at everyone. But look at it this way. Could you manage to give just 50p more, or even £1 more, each week? Our week-end congregation numbers about 900 people. If each of you were to give that extra bit, our weekly collection would increase by £450, or even £900. Now look at the amount of the weekly collection, published on the inside page of the Newsletter, and calculate the difference that extra bit would make. It would easily meet the deficit, and we would be able to put some money by for developments, or for a rainy day. A small contribution from everyone is more valuable than a big donation from one or two, because it expresses everyone's involvement in the Parish. (Of course we would not refuse any large donations we were offered!). Please consider this suggestion; and take a good look at the leaflet that comes with this Newsletter.
