hope to be excused if I write about money matters on this first Sunday of Lent, when you might have expected a more spiritual topic. However, since one of the traditional 'good works' associated with the season is almsgiving, perhaps it is not so out of place after all.

The parish church of Holy Cross does, of course, rely for its survival on the money that is donated by you, the faithful, especially in the Sunday collection. The words that appear on page 2 of this newsletter every week. 'many thanks for your continuing generosity', are no empty phrase, but a simple reflection of this truth. Out of this we heat and light the church, maintain its fabric inside and out, provide vestments for clergy, servers and choir worthy of the House of God, buy the bread and wine and candles, print this bulletin, remunerate our first-rate organist, supply money to the diocese... A stipend, of course, is also paid from the parish to the Dominican friars who live and work here: it may be worth mentioning that this stipend has remained unchanged for almost a decade.

While our collections are holding up well, despite the financial difficulties of the time, the parish struggles to cover its costs. Last year, while total income was almost exactly £100,000, total expenditure was £106,000. Things are set to become even more difficult, since the diocese has asked us for a considerable increase in our annual donation (the 'diocesan guota'). There are also various improvements that we hope to make before too long, especially installing a new, more efficient heating system, as the present one comes to the end of its natural life.

Last year, the proportion of money donated as 'gift aid' dropped significantly. It would be very helpful if all those who are UK tax-payers, and who attend Holy Cross regularly, were to become gift aid donors, if you are not so already. There are forms available on the tables by the entrances. It is a very painless way to increase the value of your weekly donation to the parish! Naturally, we hope that those of you who are already gift-aiders will continue to be so; the boxes for the new year will be coming out shortly.

Another suggestion we'd like to make is that you consider including Holy Cross in your will. Incidentally, any beguest left to 'Holy Cross Church' will go entirely to the parish; if you wish to leave money for the Dominican community as such, that would need to be stated explicitly.

In any case, we hope you have a good and fruitful Lent!

Whilst an attempt to legalise so-called bedroom abortions was defeated in the High Court on 14 February, BPAS, one of the largest providers of abortion, has launched a new effort to achieve this by a different route. They are asking the Government to issue regulations that will sanction bedroom abortions. The do not care that women who abort at home suffer high risk to their health, nor that they have to bring in the sad remains of their own baby to a hospital to verify they have 'aborted correctly'. The Leicester branch of SPUC (see us on the parish website) asks parishioners to write to their MP at the House of Commons, London SW1A 0AA asking him or her to urge the Health Secretary not to widen the law about where abortions may take place, as this could create greater risk to women's health and lead to an increasing number of abortions.
