N these Sunday Gospels we have Jesus preaching to the people. When we come to church, and listen, we become the people He preaches to. What he preaches, again and again, is what is called the 'Kingdom of God'. We aren't hearing His words, but words in English replacing what he says.

The word 'Kingdom' suggests a place, 'somewhere' else, where God is. A better word, to replace what He says, might be, the 'Reign' of God. That can make us think of some, future, 'time', when God will 'appear'.

Jesus might have meant all this, but more than this. We could try another word, for what He says; a word like 'Regimen'. A regimen is a way of life. That would mean us, living very close to God, and with God's will. It would be something, for us, to do, here and now. Many of the parables would make more sense like this.

However, He might have meant a lot more even than that. He once or twice seems to mean by 'Kingdom of God' - Himself. He said 'The Kingdom of God is among you' - not 'within' you, as some have it.

He meant, Himself. God, 'here and now', was right in front of them. This was what people could not, and would not, see. They had Him crucified for saying it. It comes down to our deepest feelings. You must either follow, or reject this.

How do you think of God? Do you think of God? If you don't think of God at all you imagine a vague 'spirit', like the air; a 'no-body'. You feel 'It' as a 'mystery', like deep dark space, frightening, eternally silent. You fear an 'absentee landlord', to pay rent to, and never see, or want to see.

Or are we ready to 'have' Him, as one of ourselves, living, and dying, among us? Jesus, we learn so much about, in His life and death and life after death? Can we believe Him, how He comes, so much, into our lives, in Holy Communion? Can we really take Him home, and have Him at home, all week? Learn from Him how close at hand to us, and concerned with us, God is?

We will do, especially if we are close at hand, and concerned, for each other. It seems the way to find this out. Many of the parables say just that.
