## 'Behold I will dwell in the midst of you'

HAT do we celebrate on the feast of Corpus Christi? The fact that Jesus Christ is still on earth. True, He ascended into heaven as the apostles watched. But we also have His words, 'I am with you always, till the end of the world'. He could have fulfilled this promise simply by guiding the Church from heaven: listening to our prayers and interceding for us with His Father. But we believe, as Catholics, that He does something more than that. He remains on earth, really present, in the Blessed Sacrament. Christ is really present, not only at Mass, but wherever the Blessed Sacrament is kept, in all the tabernacles of the world.

This is an astonishing thing: yet we might almost say that nothing could be more natural. Do we not all like to be with those whom we love? Christ loves us, and so He wishes to be with us. And being God, He has found a way in which He can be with us, without leaving heaven. 'I will not leave you orphans,' He told the apostles, 'I will come to you'. And St Paul, in another context, reassures us, 'the Word is very close to you ... in your mouths, and in your heart'.

How cold a place our world would be, if this were not so; if the charity of the Sacred Heart were no longer on earth to warm us! There are few sights sadder than a church which has once been a House of God and has now been turned over to profane use, with its tabernacle empty or destroyed. But the whole world would be such a abandoned church, had our Lord not given us the Blessed Sacrament.

Pope Paul VI put it like this: 'As long as the Eucharist is kept in our churches and oratories, Christ is truly the Emmanuel, that is, "God with us". Day and night He is in our midst, he dwells with us, full of grace and truth. He raises the level of morality, nourishes virtues, consoles the afflicted, strengthens the weak.'

Corpus Christi, and the closely-related feast of the Sacred Heart, are times for us to ask ourselves, 'Do I appreciate the miracle which is Christ's continual presence on earth? How can I make more return for His love towards me in the Blessed Sacrament? When I come into His presence, do I show Him the reverence which is His due: by prayerfulness, by silence, by the way I receive Holy Communion, even by my manner of dress?'

A serious humorist once asked, 'If you were arrested for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you?' Likewise, we can ask ourselves, 'If I were arrested for believing in the real presence; for believing that the Blessed Sacrament is God; would there be enough evidence to convict me?' May we all be found 'guilty' of this charge!
