It is vital that you follow social distancing when in church, so that we can continue to be open and be safe and uninfected. Please respect these arrangements, and particularly regarding our closing times. Please also keep in touch with us and with one another. I'm trying to get round the parish by telephone.

Be intent on prayer, and whatever may happen will turn to our good.

CORONAVIRUS EPIDEMIC - A DEVELOPING SITUATION

The Conference of Bishops (CBCEW) has now suspended the public celebration of Masses and other services with a congregation. We are now celebrating our Masses behind closed doors, and broadcasting them *on our Facebook Page*. Please visit <u>Holy Cross Priory Leicester (Dominicans)</u>

CORONAVIRUS - WHAT ARE WE DOING AT HOLY CROSS?

The main thing to note is that we are following the up-to-date statutory advice, and not acting on privately held opinions, professional or otherwise. To that end, the principal **restrictive measures** we have in place are as follows:

- Masses are celebrated without congregations present, and all Masses are livestreamed at the usual times. The Faithful are asked to make a spiritual communion, formulae for which are provided;
- The church remains open during the day from 8:30am to 12 noon, and from 1pm-5:30pm, for private prayer and devotion;
- At the present time, Confessions are available at the usual times only.

In the meantime, the following things will **remain in place**:

- The Domomican Fathers continue to offer pastoral care of the dying, and chaplaincy support to the LRI and other hospitals, in collaboration with the arrangements made by the University Hospitals of Leicester (UHL) NHS Trust.
- Provision for other ordinary sacramental support that falls within the guidelines, such as baptisms, marriages, funerals are subject to guidance and can be discussed with us by email <u>leicester@english.op.org</u> – this is by far the best way to contact us
- Our Facebook page is the principal vehicle for communication at present.

CORONAVIRUS - CARING FOR ONE ANOTHER

As cases increase and anxiety rises, it is more likely that the more vulnerable members of our faith community may experience symptoms and have to self-isolate. This is especially the case for the elderly and for students, and also for those who might be outside this category, but living alone for whatever reason. *Please let us know at the Priory if it becomes necessary for you to self-isolate, so that we can keep in touch and provide assistance as and when appropriate and necessary.* Please also be ready if possible to offer assistance, in a safe and appropriate way, to anyone who might require our assistance. Keep an eye on our facebook presence and also communicate with us as necessary.

DEVELOPING THE FRASSATI CENTRE

Unfortunately, the apostolate of the Frassati Centre as it is being developed currently falls under the category of "extra-curricular" pastoral gatherings, and as such are suspended. Therefore, we will not have the planned scripture sessions during Lent, nor any Frassati young adult groups. Provision for sacramental catechesis is under consideration in the short term. However, the good news is we have been able to start some low-level works in getting the building project going. So onwards!
