Pastoral Message from Fr David Rocks OP to all the communities under the Pastoral Care of Holy Cross Priory

Dear Friends,

It has now been quite a while since things felt 'normal', and many weeks since we gathered together. We await the news of 'relaxation' of lockdown as we gather this weekend, but it is clear that there is some time before us yet until this will bring us to a situation that would feel more regular. Please be aware that your priests are here to offer their ministry in whatever ways we can at this difficult time. One suggestion made very recently was that I could send you a 'pastoral message' on a weekly basis. I'm not sure I can commit to that, but I can send one out occasionally. And so here I am.

As I've said before, there are so many members of our communities that minister on the front line, as it where – every level of the NHS, our care homes and schools, shops, essential services. When you are out clapping on Thursdays, please pray for them and their families. These are people we know and love, they have coffee with us on Sundays and we see them at social events, we walk beside them in processions, we chat with them on the street. They're doing an amazing job, and their families are making sacrifices so that can happen. On behalf of all of us, I want to say a sincere word of thanks. It isn't easy
