In the meantime, the following things will remain in place:

- The Dominican Fathers continue to offer pastoral care of the dying, and chaplaincy support to the LRI and other hospitals, in collaboration with the arrangements made by the University Hospitals of Leicester (UHL) NHS Trust. <u>Please contact the on-call Catholic Chaplain through the ward staff if you require assistance.</u>
- Marriages and baptisms are suspended at this time, except in extreme emergencies, funerals are subject to guidance and can be discussed with us by email <u>leicester@english.op.org</u> – this is by far the best way to contact us. We are gradually catching up with everyone by phone, but please be aware we are dealing with an extraordinary number of calls
- Our Facebook page is the principal vehicle for communication at present.

Any adult who wishes to become a Catholic or receive Confirmation should join our RCIA programme, which will meet remotely very soon.

VISITING THE SICK

The Faithful who are sick and housebound cannot receive Holy Communion for the time being. The Parish Priest and his assistants are keen to remain in touch by telephone for the time being.

REOPENING OF CHURCHES FOR PRIVATE PRAYER

It has recently been announced that the Government have provided permission for church buildings to plan to reopen from 15 June. The detailed guidance is subject to compliance with regulations and the completion of complex risk assessments, which will raise a number of issues for us. <u>We are committed to opening the church as soon</u> as we can, but we must comply with the advice in order to do so.
