## **ELECTION**

lection' is a word which has several different meanings. Perhaps the first idea it suggests to us is the election of members of Parliament or local government, especially at the moment, when the General Election is only a few weeks away. We 'elect' the person who will represent us at Westminster or in the Leicester City or County Council. The word comes from the Latin, 'electio', which means 'choice' or 'selection'. So we 'choose' or 'select' the one we prefer from a number of candidates. And the process by which we select a new Parliament or Council is called 'an election'.

Voting in an election is, of course, an important part of our responsibility as members of a democratic society. Many people, especially among the young, feel disillusioned about politics, and have given up voting. But to stop voting does not help in any way to right the wrongs of our society. Remember the saying: 'For evil to prevail, it only needs good people to do nothing'. Perhaps we underestimate the power of public opinion. If a sufficient number of people want something strongly, then it will certainly happen.

But there is another way in which the word 'election' is used, and there was a short note about this in last Sunday's Newsletter. It spoke of the RCIA\* group from our parish which was going to Nottingham 'for the Rite of Election, thus beginning their final stage on the journey to becoming Catholics'. Nowadays, adults who are considering becoming Catholics, go through a period of enquiry and instruction for several months, leading up to Lent and Easter. By the beginning of Lent they will have completed their instruction in the Catholic faith, and will have decided whether or not they wish to ask for baptism and the other sacraments. On the first Sunday of Lent they come before the Bishop in the cathedral, and are formally asked if they wish 'to enter fully into the life of the Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist'. They reply: 'We do'. They then write their names in the Book of the Elect.

In this context, 'elect' and 'election' are not expressing our choice so much as God's choice. God chooses us to be his people, and we respond by our own choice and decision. But the initiative lies with God. You remember Jesus' words to the apostles: 'You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last' (John 15:16). This process of choice and election goes right back to early in the Old Testament. God chose Abraham to be the 'father of many nations'. God chose Moses to lead the descendants of Abraham out of slavery in Egypt, towards the Promised Land. God chose David to be King over his people, and to establish a dynasty from which would be born the Saviour of the world. God chose Mary to be the Mother of that Saviour and Mother of us all. And so it goes on now. God chooses each one of us, to be his friend; to be part of his Body, the Church; to inherit the Kingdom and finally to be at home in the heavenly Jerusalem. 'Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift' (2 Corinthians 9:15).
