# "PRAISE BE...."

hese words open St Francis of Assisi's famous canticle in praise of God's wonderful creation. Pope Francis has chosen them as a fitting title for his eagerly-awaited encyclical on the environment. Addressing it to the whole world, he sets out to help us to have a change of heart. He wants us to develop a reverence for the world in which we live - and with that reverence, a sense of responsibility.

There are three themes dominating this encyclical. Firstly, a sense of reverence for the whole of creation, and above all for its creator, Secondly, God has made us people guardians of His handiwork, with the responsibility of using, preserving, developing and handing on to future generations an environment, with its resources.

But we are failing in our care for what Pope Francis calls, "Our Common Home." We are damaging the environment; our pollution of the atmosphere is at least partly responsible for global warming. We are very wasteful of the earth's natural resources, and unjust in their distribution. This is the third theme, which provoked Pope Francis to write this encyclical.

Firstly, reverence for the whole of creation. God has loved into existence each and every part of it. That makes even the smallest creature precious to Him. Each reflects and gives glory to God, simply by being itself. That gives it a dignity of its own: it should be valued not simply because it is useful to man.

That means that we, to whom God has entrusted His creatures, should show each and every one of them the same loving respect as does their maker. That means that we must strive to protect endangered species, and the delicate balance of ecosystems in which they and we live. Our world is God's world. With Jacob we should exclaim, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven, and I did not know it," (Gen. 28. 16-17). The Son of God has even made our world His home!

Pope Francis calls all of us to recognise the damage we are doing to our world, to God's world - before it's too late. He stresses the triple relationships between the loving creative God, the environment in which He has placed us, and us people, whom He has appointed as its guardians. The sins of selfishness and shortsightedness have disrupted this delicate balance. Individualism has caused us to forget that we belong not only to one human family, but to God's single family. That makes us responsible for each other and for the God-given world in which we all live.

Pope Francis calls us to appreciate God's wonderful gift of the world He has created, to cherish it, to develop it and hand it on, in a better condition, to future generations. This will not only enriches our lives as human beings, but is also an essential dimension of Christian spirituality.

The Assisted Dying Bill will be debated in Parliament on 11th September. It is important that MPs attend the debate in order to oppose the proposals. Countries which have already legalised assisted suicide have fully embraced a culture of death. Just days ago the Dutch Paediatric Association said that allowing teenagers to ask for euthanasia discriminates against younger children and is asking that the age limit for doctor-assisted death be removed. To avoid that becoming reality in the UK please write now to your MP and ask him or her to attend the debate on 11th September. Please write before MPs leave for their summer recess on 21st July.
