THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY

The New Testament does not mention Our Lady's Assumption. But that is hardly surprising. During the first century, Christians were grappling with the overwhelming experience of Jesus, his crucifixion and resurrection, the gift of the Spirit and his life in the Church. And it was still too early to see fully what Mary's role was and express it clearly. But the few places in the New Testament where Mary is mentioned are all highly significant. And by pondering over them we have gradually come to understand more fully Mary's role in our salvation.

It all begins with the Annunciation. Mary is 'full of grace', God's total gift. And so she is able to say a wholehearted YES to His invitation to be the Mother of His Son. She enters unreservedly into God's plan for our salvation: 'let it be to me according to your word'. Her Motherhood is not a mere biological event, not is it only for herself. It is 'for us and for our salvation'.

This is underlined in two other glimpses we have of her in the New Testament. Having been in the background throughout Jesus' ministry, she stands at the foot of the cross. She associates herself with his agonising death, saying as he did: 'Thy will be done'. And she accepts explicitly her role as Mother of all Mankind: 'Mother, behold your son. Son, behold your Mother'. Again, she is present with the apostles, praying and waiting for the gift of the Spirit at Pentecost, when the new glorified humanity won by Jesus is first visibly shared with his people, in the founding of the Church.

At each point she is involved in the saving work of God, receiving in herself, unhampered by any sin, the redemption achieved by Christ. So she shares fully now in the Resurrection of Jesus, for that is what the Assumption means. She, who by faith has received salvation in her body, for herself and for us all, has received it totally; for it is the salvation of the whole human being, body and soul. Ordination to the priesthood here at Holy Cross. You may recall that Bishop Patrick, in his pastoral letter last month, mentioned forthcoming ordinations in the diocese. One of the ordinands is Kevin Athaide, and many people may well recall that he was a server here some years ago (as was, incidentally, his brother Keith). His ordination will be on Saturday 12 September at 11.30am, and we do hope as many people as possible will be able to attend this very special occasion.

King Richard III. August 22nd is the anniversary of his death at the Battle of Bosworth Field 530 years ago. In this special year of his re-interment in Leicester Cathedral, a Solemn Mass will be offered for the repose of his soul here at Holy Cross at 7.15pm on Friday 21st August. This Mass will be celebrated in the traditional Dominican Rite, materially unchanged since King Richard's own times. If the Dominican friars resident in Leicester in 1485 offered Mass for him on hearing the news of his death — as we may hope they did — this is the rite they would have used.
