- On Sunday, 13 September, Fr Kevin will celebrate his first Mass at 10.30am, and impart his blessing. This day will be the transferred titular feast of our church, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and there will be the opportunity to venerate the relic of the True Cross.
- After Sunday's Mass, there will be a Bring & Share lunch in the parish hall. Please bring food to the hall for this before Mass.
