## 1215 And All That

2015 has been a memorable year in Leicester due largely to the events surrounding the re-burial of King Richard III. Here in Holy Cross alone a Requiem Mass was celebrated by Cardinal Vincent Nichols. Later, a Dominican Rite Mass (with Catafalque) was celebrated for the repose King Richard's soul. However, 2015 is the anniversary of yet another, less known, but more important event in the life of the Church, the 4<sup>th</sup> Lateran Council. This was an ecumenical council summoned by the great Pope Innocent III to address reforms in the Church, to promote the defence of Christendom, and foster unity among the Christian nations and peoples.

Why is it so important? Well for one it was a key moment in St Dominic's quest to found his order of Preaching Friars. So the Dominicans are in a sense the offspring of Lateran IV. (It could be argued that the Franciscans are as well, but that's hardly the same thing!). Also, the Council passed a canon known as *Omnis utriusque sexus*, which states that all the faithful, of either sex, are obliged to confess their sins and receive Holy Communion at least once a year, at Easter or thereabouts. This canon is still in force, and is part of Church teaching to this day. It still affects each one of us, whether we pay heed to it or not.

Finally, the Profession of Faith of the Council, *Firmiter*, states very neatly, with the greatest precision and concision, the utter transcendence of God. "For between Creator and creature, no similarity can be expressed, without implying a greater dissimilarity." In other words, however we might try and think of God by comparing him with his effects (creatures), we can never comprehend the full transcendence and otherness of the divine nature. God is always God, and we will always be creatures, even when enjoying eternal glory.

So although it may seem like a long time ago in a galaxy far away, Lateran IV deeply shaped the life of the Church as well as beautifully stating perennial truths about God. So we give God thanks for so great a Council, and for the great Pope Innocent III.
