

The YEAR of MERCY – continued

Last Sunday the Holy Door at the west end of this Church was formally closed; and today it will be formally opened again, to mark the start of the Jubilee 'Year of Mercy'. And last Sunday, Fr Isidore used the Back Page of the Newsletter to introduce the theme of the Year of Mercy, quoting from Pope Francis's letter to the Church, 'Face of Mercy'. But of course there is much more to be said about God's mercy, and ours, than can be fitted on to one page. In fact, mercy is one of the great themes running through the Bible.

Take, for example, the parable of the Good Samaritan. You remember that in the story the traveller is attacked by thieves who steal his money and leave him 'half-dead'. A priest and a Levite pass by but do nothing to help. Then a Samaritan comes along and is 'moved with pity'; so he does something about it, dressing the traveller's wounds and taking him to the shelter and comfort of the inn. At the end of the story, Jesus says to his hearers: 'Which of the three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' They reply: 'The one who showed him mercy'. And Jesus says: 'Go and do likewise'.

So this is a story about one person showing mercy to another. His mercy is practical help given to another in his need. It is not to do with feelings, at least not with comfortable feelings. The Samaritan was 'moved with pity', realising that if he had been in the same position he would have had desperate need for help; so he gives the wounded man what he needs. That is true mercy. It is a story which shows one person giving mercy to another, even complete stranger, even though it costs him much.

But it is also a story about the divine mercy. Jesus is the Good Samaritan, who sees our wounds and our distress, and sets about to bring us healing and comfort, even at the cost of Calvary. In fact of course it is this divine mercy which comes first. Because God has shown mercy on us, we are able to have mercy on one another. And that is what this Year of Mercy is all about. Pope Francis calls us to have practical mercy on our needy brothers and sisters, because that is what God has done for us all. He echoes the words of Jesus: 'Go and do likewise'.

MONEY MATTERS: Last Weekend's collections – Offertory Collection £1538.58 (of which £581.50 was Gift Aided and £957.08 was not), and in addition the parish receives approximately £240 per week in donations made by standing order, nearly all of which are Gift Aided; Solidarity Fund £4.34; Friends of Holy Cross £30.38; Holy Souls £5.80; Grenada Church Restoration £ - . The retiring collection for the Advent Market came to £484.21 (of which £30 was Gift Aided), bringing the total for the Market to around £4000. Congratulations to all involved in any way.
