## THE WORD AT WORK: OUR WEEKLY REFLECTION

#### **OUR SHARE IN GOD'S LIFE**

Many of us were taught by our parents that clear and distinct definition: The Most Holy Trinity is a mystery that we are bound to believe but cannot understand. Perhaps we should just leave it at that. Simple answers are always the best kind.

It is futile to try and understand the doctrine of the Trinity. We can say some sensible and erudite things about it, but we cannot get on top of it, we can never possess or master it. But we can spend our lives in worship and awe of it. It is right that we are totally consumed by it, because it represents what God has done for us, and what he is doing in us and for us.

Our endless exploration of the mystery of the Trinity is something that should invigorate us, not something that should overpower us. God does not seek to consume us but to embrace us and be ever closer to us.

As we have been marking the Jubilee Year of Mercy, and the 800<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Order, many great themes have been placed before us. It has been an opportunity for personal and community reflection, a time for us to mark our achievements and our progress, but also to consider the ways in which we can grow in our faith and our ministry. We have reflected on the themes of healing and forgiveness – in the Church and in our families – and now we have an opportunity to consider how we can bring what we have shared together, guided by God's grace, to bear fruit in the lives of others. The various ways in which we can preach God's mercy and love, through solidarity with those in need and collaboration with others, is a grace-filled moment of transformation. In such moments, a glimpse of the love and tranquility, the freshness and the glory, of the Holy Trinity is revealed.

During the rest of this year, we hope to use this section of our Newsletter to reflect on some of the key themes that are brought to mind in this special year. In the next weeks, we will begin this with a series of reflections by Peter and Isidore Clarke OP on the Corporal Works of Mercy.

As the weeks progress, and our time of prayerful reflection continues, it is hoped that these reflections will inspire us with new energy, so that the mercy we are celebrating can be made known ever more widely. There is much to be done, and it would be futile to think that it will ever be complete, until we are finally at one with the Holy Trinity, and God's mercy has completed its work in us. Our opportunity to reflect on the theme of Mercy, and on the importance of our Dominican Life and Mission, still has so much to offer us. Let's build on that.
