READINGS FOR THE 27TH SUNDAY

1ST READING: ACTS 1:12-14

St Luke presents us with an image of the infant Church at prayer. Of course, they had inherited all the great traditions of prayer from the Old Testament, but are now renewed entirely by the giving of the spirit of the Risen Christ. The Church never prays without Our Lady, and Our Lady is always praying for the Church.

2ND READING:

GOSPEL READING: LUKE 1:26-38 - (SEE BELOW)

DOMINICAN RITE MASS: ROSARY SUNDAY

EPISTLE 8:22-35

Hear Wisdom speaks, as it were, *in persona Christi*, as the 2nd Person of the Blessed Trinity. These words can be applied by extension to Our Lady, who is the *Sedes Sapientiae*, the Seat of Wisdom, and among all people shares most deeply in the Wisdom of God.

GOSPEL: LUKE 1:26-38

It is impossible to meditate enough on the Gospel of the Annunciation. Here we see the perfect co-operation between grace and nature, even our human nature which in the case of Our Lady, was preserved entirely free from the stain of original sin. "O Blessed Virgin, speak your human word and conceive the Divine Word. Pronounce the transitory word and embrace the everlasting Word." (St Bernard of Clairvaux)

THE WORD AT WORK: OUR WEEKLY REFLECTION

SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY - 2: COUNSELLING THE DOUBTFUL

Our Twin Clarke Team return for their series on the Spiritual Works of Mercy as the Jubilee Year draws to a close.

This series will be interspersed with reflections from Fr Greg on some of the Dominican Mystics.

"Let your acquaintances be many. but let your advisers be one in a thousand, "
(Ecclus.6.6).

So many of us have anxieties and doubts, even about God Himself and His Church. So many people do need wise, Godly advice. But what a huge responsibility to attempt the 2nd Spiritual Work of Mercy –to Counsel the Doubtful.

In the Prophecy of Isaiah God promised to send a 'WONDERFUL COUNSELOR,' (Isaiah 9.5). Christians believe this was Jesus. He proved to be compassionate and wise. He spoke of Himself as the Good Shepherd, searching, reaching out to those who had lost their way in life. What is more, He claimed to be, 'the Way, the Truth and the Life!' (Jn.14.6). Someone to turn to, someone to cling to.

Jesus knew a time would come when He would return to His Heavenly Father. Then He would act through His Church. He would prompt those with spiritual, religious doubts and problems to search out people who could continue His sensitive ministry of counselling. In assisting them we were to share God's truth, God's wisdom...not our personal opinions and piety. Even as pious people, especially as pious people, we must know our limitations. It would be irresponsible, even dangerous counselling, to tell someone, "If you have faith and I pray for you, all your problems will be solved." That person may urgently need to see a doctor, a psychiatrist, or a professional counsellor.

Like Solomon of long ago, we must pray for the humility to want the Wisdom that comes from God (Wisdom 9.3). We must also pray for those coming to us with their religious doubts and problems...that they may receive the grace to act upon the GODLY WORD they have heard – perhaps from us.

Today there are so many self-appointed shapers of public opinion; so many mixed messages, so much confusion! We should note well what St. John wrote in his First Letter, "My dear friends, not every spirit is to be trusted, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets are at large in the world," (Ch.4.1).

There is a desperate need for this 2nd Spiritual Work of Mercy - Counsel the Doubtful. It is indeed a great act of mercy for godly sanity to save the world from the self-destruction it is bringing upon itself through the persuasive lunacy that advocates the soft option rather than the tough necessity!

Does anyone seriously believe that "The Voice of the People is the Voice of God?"
