FR RICHARD'S REFLECTION

WE WISH YOU A MERRY CHRISTMAS

For many of us, this Christmas is going to be rather less happy than usual, for obvious reasons. But we should nevertheless find ways of making merry.

I say 'merry' deliberately, because it is a word we especially associate with Christmas. No-one says 'merry birthday', do they? Making merry is about celebrating, but it's about more than that: it's about relaxing, letting our hair down; when the work is over and the day is done, when the children are finally asleep, when the war is over, when the virus has been conquered, when the journey is ended, we can finally, at last, make merry.

It may not feel like it, but at Christmas we celebrate the fact that the journey is over. That journey is the great journey of humanity which is our movement from darkness into light. Adam and Eve were cast out – cast themselves out, really – from the light of paradise into the darkness of exile; and that experience of walking in the valley of darkness has been typical of human lives from that day to this. We see it even in the Christmas story: Mary and Joseph driven from their home in Nazareth, driven out into the night, to bed down among the cattle.

Yet, in a strange and astonishing way, in the midst of this darkness, this exile, this homelessness, our true home appears. Because when Jesus is born, God makes his home among us. And this really means that he made us at home with him. As Christ comes among us from on high, it is we who have truly come home. Home to God, for our exile is over. Whatever may be going on in the world, we Christians know that we are no longer walking in the valley of the shadow of death, because God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness, into his own marvelous light.

So it is time to make merry indeed. This is not a non-too-subtle excuse for drunkenness: we get drunk to forget, but we make merry to remember. We drink because we are afraid, we make merry because we have been set free from fear. We have been set free to remember that we are loved, that God is at home with us and we are at home with God. So eat, drink and be merry, for tomorrow we live.
