FR ISIDORE'S LAST REFLECTION

ADVENT - CHRISTMAS: 'COME, LORD JESUS, COME'

The holy season of Advent is meant to shake us out of our self-sufficiency. We can so easily push God into the background. We do not allow Him to 'intrude' into our daily lives, into the way we think and act. When the psalmist condemns the fool for saying 'there is no God' he is not accusing him of denying the very existence of God. No, the fool's folly is to think he can manage his life very well without God. But if God were ever to cease sustaining our very existence we would collapse into nothingness. God is with us, in all that we are and do -except for our sinning. During Advent we focus on several special ways in which God comes into our lives and with His help we try to make Him welcome.

Advent reminds us that God chose the Jewish people and made a covenant of love with them. He gave them laws to protect their relationship with Him and with each other. Like a good shepherd, He was always with them, guiding and protecting them. His spokesmen were the prophets. They kept God's people on the right path and prophesied that God would come into their midst as the saviour-messiah of the world. That Messiah, of course, is Jesus Christ, whose birthday we celebrate at Christmas. During Advent we prepare ourselves to make Him welcome. It is amazing that God wants to share our human life because He loves us. Advent reminds us, too, of the different ways that we meet Jesus in our daily lives — through prayer, Sacraments and in each other. In different ways, Jesus knocks at our door,

hoping we will open up to Him, for example, in helping poor people. The Corporal and Spiritual works of mercy prepare us for the most decisive moment when Jesus comes to us in our lives – the moment of death. If we have welcomed Him during our earthly lives, He will welcome us into eternal life.

Death is a taboo subject. We don't want to think about it, especially when we are young and full of life but none of us can avoid it. I know I could die at any moment but that doesn't frighten me. Why? Our faith gives us hope in a far better life beyond the grave. Then we will share the life and happiness of God Himself. We should look forward to that; we should long for that. None of us is fit to enter the presence of the All-Holy God, we are all sinners. But we do not trust in what we deserve but in His infinite love and mercy. My faith is sustained by the words of St John's gospel "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that everyone who believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life...." and by the words of St. Paul's "I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." His sacrificial love and mercy for each of us is the only hope I need. That gives me the confidence to pray each day and night, "Come, Lord Jesus, come." Now I'm impatient for Jesus to welcome me into His Kingdom at the hour of my death.

Jesus will come in glory at the end of time to wipe away all evil – the completion of God's plan of Salvation. We should all long for that 'Day of the Lord,' as we join the first Christians in praying, "Come, Lord Jesus, come!"

- Please sign the register when you come into the church and Hand sanitizers continue to be used when coming into the church. Continue to keep a safe distance from others.
- Entrance is through the Wellington Street door and exit is through the New Walk door.
- Masks are still worn, including when singing and please do not hold conversations in church.
