'ON THE FEAST OF THE NATIVITY' BY ST LEO

Our Saviour, dearly Beloved, was born this day. Let us rejoice! Sadness is not becoming upon the Birth Day of Life Itself, which, now that the fear of death is ended, fills us with gladness, because of our own promised immortality. No one is excluded from sharing in this cheerfulness, for the reason of our joy is common to everyone. Our Lord came that He might bring deliverance to all.

Let the saint rejoice, for he draws nigh to the palm of victory. Let the sinner too rejoice, since he is invited to grace. Receiving Communion: Please place one palm over another. **THEY NEED TO BE FLAT.** A few people are still cupping their hands which makes it difficult to avoid touching them. Those who prefer to receive on the tongue should wait until the end of Communion.

- Please sign the register when you come into the church and Hand sanitizers continue to be used when coming into the church. Continue to keep a safe distance from others.
- Entrance is through the Wellington Street door and exit is through the New Walk door.
- Masks are still worn, including when singing and please do not hold conversations in church.
- Please Note: From Fri. 10th Dec, face coverings in places of worship became mandatory by government law.
