POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO US AT LENT

Lent is a favorable time for personal and community renewal as it leads us to the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. St Paul (Gal 6:9) evokes the image of sowing and reaping, so dear to Jesus. He speaks to us of a *kairos*, an opportune time for sowing goodness in view of a future harvest. Lent is such an opportune time but so is our entire existence. All too often in our lives, greed, pride and the desire to possess have the upper hand. Lent invites us to conversion, to a change in mindset, so that life's truth and beauty may be found not so much in possessing as in giving.

The first to sow is God himself, who with great generosity continues to sow abundant seeds of goodness in our human family. During Lent we are called to respond to God's gift by accepting his word which is living and active. What about the harvest? Anyone who sows generously will reap generously as well. But what kind of harvest are we talking about? A first fruit of the goodness we sow appears in ourselves even in our little acts of kindness. When we sow for the benefit of others we share in God's own benevolent love. The word of God broadens and elevates our vision. Those who are intimately united to him in love will also be united to his resurrection for eternal life. Then the upright will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father (Mt 13:43).

Let us not grow tired of doing good. Bitter disappointment, deep concern for the challenges ahead and the poverty of our resources can make us

Lent is a favorable time to seek out those in need, those who need a sympathetic ear and a good word, to visit those who are lonely, to love those abandoned and rejected, those discriminated against and marginalized. Let us persevere in doing good one step at a time. If we fall let us stretch out our hand to the Father who always lifts us up. May Our Lady accompany us with her maternal presence, so that this Lent may bring forth fruits of eternal salvation.
