## Mary, Our Mother

May is a Marian month. In order to understand the role that the Mother of God has in our tradition, we need to start with the communion of saints.

Behind that seemingly simple statement from the Apostles' Creed lies an important belief, that we are truly connected to each other. 'No one is an island'. There are Christian bonds between baptised people but there are also simple human bonds that we all have. One can clearly see how that works: people have many and different kind of relationships. There is family and relatives. There are friends and colleagues. There are neighbours, acquaintances and fellow countrymen. The list can be very long.

What happens to these when we come to see God face to face? What will happen to these at the day of the resurrection of all? Of course, you will still be you, and I will still be me. Hopefully we will be among the blessed, although changed and glorified and having access to the fullness of truth. You can see here clearly how special Mary is. Not only is she the first and only faithful disciple of Jesus (a Christian bond), but she is also his own mother (a human bond). Nothing can change the strength and the rank of that bond between her and Christ. But she was also given to us, we believe, at the foot of the cross.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister

Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then he said to the disciple,

"Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. (John 19:25-27) Since then, we believe, Mary has become the Mother of us, Christ's disciples, and so we enjoy that special relationship with her too, a relationship that is different from other saints.

People who object to us Catholics putting too much stress on Mary are often misled by this statement: God loves everyone with the same love. If this is true, how can Mary be special, or more special than other saints? Yes, God does love everyone with the same love, but some people are closer to him than others. God is not a thing, after all, but a community of the Holy Trinity. Just as the divine relationship between the Father and the Son is unfathomable and tremendously important, surely there still remains an important bond between the human Mother and the Son who is both fully human and fully divine, even after they have been taken up to heaven and the fullness of the presence of God?
