#### The Eucharist

From the earliest times Christians regularly met together to 'do what Christ commanded them to do', that is to break bread and bless the chalice. We have come to call it the Eucharist, Holy Mass, Divine Liturgy, or Sacred Mysteries. In this short piece I will point out a few key elements of liturgy, which I hope will deepen your sense of participation in it. The way we celebrate the Mass in the Roman Rite has changed in the last century, however some things remain the same, as they are the core elements of what it means to do the Divine Liturgy.

First, we are rational creatures. God has revealed himself to us through Jesus - his Only Begotten Word, and through the Scriptures, so that we can get to know Him and engage with Him, however, God is not someone we can fully understand or comprehend. Similarly, even though the Mass has a clear structure, it remains at heart something we are not able fully to explain and understand. Therefore, the Sacred Mysteries Jesus left behind for us are full of signs. Divine Liturgy is a rite, a ritual, where the visible gestures and clear words are accompanied by silent prayer, signs and symbols. It is to remind us of the invisible and incomprehensible reality which lies behind it. God is not someone we can domesticate or tame, if you like, and the Holy Mass, in which angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven are present with us as we pray, also does not belong solely to the order of this world. This is why the music we use at Mass is sacred music, reserved and written for this occasion alone. The same goes for vessels and vestments, etc. Some groups within the church have attempted to bring the Divine Liturgy down to this earth, if you like, by

using pop or other 'worldly' music, or by not wearing vestments, etc – generally speaking, by trying to strip the Mass of all its symbolism and sense of mystery. Celebrating the Divine Liturgy in this way, although it may initially make one feel more at ease, can hinder one from finding a deeper and more profound understanding of the invisible reality of the sacrament.

Second, the Divine Liturgy is not a show. We, the baptised, come together as one, as members of the Body of Christ, to offer Christ to the Father, and to eat His Body and drink His Blood, 'the only acceptable sacrifice' that brings salvation to the whole world and makes us more Christ-like. In the process of doing this, we first have to accept God's mercy (the penitential rite). It is not because we are all evil and utterly sinful. It is because only through God's mercy, and not through our own goodness, can we be his adopted children. Having received his mercy, we then offer the sacrifice. It enables us to 'go out to the whole world' not only to preach the Good News but also to share the very mercy we have received, even with those that the world considers unworthy. In short, participating in the Divine Liturgy can not only strengthen us, but also remind us of what we are called to do in the world: to be its light, a living sign pointing beyond this very world in which we live.
