WALSINGHAM PILGRIMAGE

Walsingham, in Norfolk, is England's principal place of pilgrimage, and people have been going there to show their devotion to Our Lady since 1061 – nearly a thousand years! May, being the month of Our Lady, is obviously the best time of year to go, and this year the Dominican Friars of England will be going there on Pentecost Sunday, 19 May. We would very much like you to join us.

A coach will depart from outside the church on Wellington Street at 8.10 a.m., and will stop off at St Joseph's, Goodwood Road, before going to Walsingham. There will be a Mass at 11 a.m., followed by a picnic lunch – please bring your own food. We then walk from the Catholic Shrine, which is about a mile outside the village, to the parish church in the village, where we will have exposition and benediction, and tea, which will be provided. The cost is £25, but please let me know if you would like to come and find the cost difficult. The coach will set off again at 5.30 p.m., and we will be back at 8 p.m. Please fill in one of the forms by the church doors, and I look forward to seeing you there.

SHORT TALKS

The friars are giving a series of short talks on the Catholic Faith at 11 a.m. on Saturday mornings in the Frassati Centre. They are just 10 to 15 minutes long, with time for questions afterwards. The next will be Fr John on Jesus Christ, on 4 May. A full list is posted on the noticeboards in the church entrances and there are some fliers by the doors too. Do come!

SACRAMENTS

- **Infant Baptisms, Marriages, Becoming Catholic:** Please apply to the parish office by email or talk to one of the priests.
- **Visiting the Sick:** If you would like a visit, either send an email or leave a telephone message with your name, tel. no. & address.
- **First Communion**: classes have begun for children who are not receiving catechism at school, so it is now too late to enrol new children. But there will be more classes next year, so please let one of the priests know
- **Confirmation:** once the First Communions have taken place, we will start Confirmation classes for any children who need them this will probably be in the autumn. If you are an adult and have not been confirmed, please speak to one of the priests and we will arrange for you to receive the sacrament.

The Dominican priests continue to offer **pastoral care to the LRI**, in collaboration with the University Hospitals of Leicester (UHL) NHS Trust. **If you or a relative are in hospital, please ask the nurse to inform the hospital chaplain. If someone is dying, ask the duty nurse to call the Catholic chaplain** – do not call yourself.

SCRIPTURE STUDY: we finished reading the Apocalypse before Easter, and will start again on 21 May, when Fr Richard's various foreign and domestic travels are over!
